CROSS BORDER INSURGENCY

680. SHRI KODIKUNNIL SURESH:

Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether cross border insurgency activities are on the rise in the country during the last three years and specifically after enhanced attacks against terror groups located in the country?
- (b) if so, the details thereof alongwith the significant achievements made in the process; and
- (c) the targeted initiatives taken by the Government to reduce insurgency in Jammu & Kashmir among the unemployed youth and its impact thereon during the said period?

ANSWER

(a) to (c): The number of cases of infiltration from all the borders and the militants killed during the last three years are as follows:

Year	2015	2016	2017
No. of infiltration cases	223	454	515
No. of militants killed	64	45	75

Security forces have taken appropriate measures by strengthening over all security including operational grid with enhanced human intelligence and

use of technical intelligence grid at the borders as well as in hinterland to deal with such insurgency activities. The Government has also continuously encouraged policies to wean the youth away from militancy by increasing the pace of developmental activities. An amount of Rs. 80,068 crore has been announced under PM Development Package, 2015 to J&K to accelerate the developmental activities in the state. In order to mainstream the youth, Bharat Darshan tours are also organized under which children between 10 to 16 years of age visit the area to interact with the people. The Government is also organizing vocational Training and skill development camps, pre-recruitment training for various Government jobs, various sports activities and carrier counselling by BSF to provide employment opportunities to youth.
