STATEMENT IN REPLY TO RAJYA SABHA STARRED QUESTION NO. *425 FOR ANSWER ON 12.04.2017 REGARDING “Implementation of Integrated Criminal Justice System in AP and Telangana”

The Integrated Criminal Justice System (ICJS) is proposed with the objective of providing an ecosystem for searching criminal data from the six pillars namely- Police, Courts, Prisons, Prosecution, Forensics and Finger prints, to improve the criminal justice delivery system of the country.

The project is being implemented on a pilot basis in the States of Andhra Pradesh, Telangana and Karnataka, by using the data from Police, Prisons and Courts.

An amount of Rs 11 crore has been released to NIC/NICSI for dashboard preparation, creation of search facility, integration of the six pillars etc, for the project so far.
