We are proud of the special and exemplary ties of friendship and co-operation that we share with Bhutan, which are built on shared values and aspirations, utmost trust and mutual respect. It is a unique partnership built on the historical and cultural linkages between the two countries. I am extremely pleased to see today a large number of our young friends from Bhutan, which reflects the centrality of people-to-people linkages, providing great character, warmth and vibrancy to our expanding ties.

Since the joint launch of the special commemorative logo last month in New Delhi and Thimphu, a number of events have already been held both in India and Bhutan, setting in motion befitting celebrations for the rest of the year. We propose to organize fifty commemorative events and exchanges, cultural and sporting activities across different states in India and Bhutan that will truly epitomize our friendship.

We welcome the opening of the Consulate of the Royal Government of Bhutan in Guwahati in the Golden Jubilee year, which would further strengthen our contacts and cooperation, for the mutual benefit of both our countries.

Excellency, it has been an honor and privilege for me to be a part of this special commemorative event today organized by the Royal Bhutanese Embassy. I would like to congratulate Ambassador Namgyel and his team for the commendable efforts.

Before I conclude, let me reaffirm, on behalf of the Government and the people of India, our abiding commitment to nurture and advance our special and privileged partnership with Bhutan.
