(a) & (b) The first meeting of the India-Myanmar Joint Consultative Commission (JCC) was held on July 16, 2015 in New Delhi. The Indian delegation was led by External Affairs Minister Smt. Sushma Swaraj and the Myanmar delegation was led by Foreign Minister U Wunna Maung Lwin. The Ministers reviewed a wide range of matters of bilateral importance including in the areas of defence and security, trade and commerce, development cooperation, consular and cultural matters and cooperation in multilateral forums. The JCC has been established as an umbrella mechanism to facilitate interaction between various line ministries on the two sides, which will further enhance India-Myanmar bilateral ties.
